

THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

THE POWER OF THE CROSS

/ t's the most Christian show on television' – no, not *Songs of Praise* but...

The only nightmares I remember having as a child were as a result of being exposed a little young, to the Hammer Horror, Christopher Lee version of Bram Stoker's famous *Dracula*. My father loved it but I certainly did not. When I heard that the BBC were doing a remake earlier this year and even though the trailers looked excellent, and even though it was written

by the same people who made the new *Sherlock*, I thought I'd give it a miss.

So imagine my surprise to read an article by Rev Peter Laws* that it was perhaps the most Christian show on television. I decided to take a look.

The profoundly theological thing about this Dracula story, and Stoker's original book, is the power of the cross. The BBC adaptation isn't pro- or anti-Christian, it just asks the question 'Why does the cross have power?'

The cross is still a significant and popular symbol in the world today. Although much of its original meaning has been lost, the image and idea still resonate across the generations.

The power of the cross is, of course, one of the dominant messages of Easter. It is because of the events just outside Jerusalem 2,000 years ago that the cross is revered. It is because of the significance of the death of Jesus that Christianity exists; that God's love and presence are available to us today; and that the prince of darkness recoils at the sight of that symbol.

About the cross, his disciple St Peter wrote, 'Jesus took our sins on his own body, by his wounds deep healing is offered to our souls'. [1 Peter 2:24 paraphrase].

About the cross, the writer of the book of Hebrews in the Bible declares, Jesus 'breaks the power of him who holds the power of death...and frees those who all their life have been enslaved to the fear of death.' [Hebrews 2: 14-15]

The message of the cross, St Paul suggests, is for those who believe in the very power of God. [1 Corinthians 1:18]

By holding a cross and by identifying with Jesus' death, the vampire hunter or just ordinary individual is asking for Jesus' help, protection and power against all the addiction, pain, evil and darkness in this world. This is something Jesus offers us through his death and assures us of through his resurrection victory on Easter Day.

When one of my children is worried about nightmares, I sometimes encourage them to hold onto a cross. It has become a symbol of comfort and help but I've been reminded this year that is also a symbol of power over fear and a promise of life beyond death.

Before I sign off this month, one final bit of theology from Dracula. Did you ever wonder why Dracula can't enter a house unless invited? It is perhaps a little strange until you realise that Jesus does something similar. In the final book of the Bible, Revelation Ch 3, verse 20, he says:

I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door I will come in and eat with them and they with me.

Easter provides the perfect opportunity to make Jesus the one we invite into our house and lives. May his light shine in our darkness and the power of his cross protect us for evermore.

May I wish you a very happy Easter.





We are pleased to be able to say that the project can now move forward and over the spring and summer work will take place to improve the boundary, fencing and pathways around the carpark and Scout hut side of the site. The work is part of the Parish's ongoing projects to restore, maintain and improve the churches for everyone to enjoy. t is lovely to finally see the Spring sunshine and the daffodils coming up around Sunninghill and Ascot. We hope you are able to enjoy the parks in the area including Victory Fields, South Ascot, Blythewood and Cheapside, particularly over the Easter holidays. All the parks have children's play areas and some also have outdoor fitness equipment. To keep hydrated there is a drinking fountain in the disabled facilities at the pavilion at Victory Fields, which is kept open during daylight hours.

Tom Green's Field and Blythewood are wildlife areas good for walking and we are pleased to be progressing with our Woodland Management programme in these areas. Our vision is to retain the woodland as a landscape feature accessible to the local community and to enhance its habitat value. At Tom Green's Field we are maintaining the open aspect of the area by the pruning and removal of dense undergrowth to allow wild flowers and grass to flourish. At Blythewood, thinning close grown areas allows more light onto the forest floor and helps to maintain diversity of tree species. Our objective is to actively encourage conservation of wildlife by creating diverse habitats. Later in the year we look forward to planting some new trees.

AVB are a South Ascot based charity providing transport for the older residents of Ascot, Sunningdale and Sunninghill who have difficulty getting to their medical appointments at, for example, hospitals, surgeries, dentists and opticians.

Driver Volunteers can donate as much or as little time as they wish, only accepting jobs which are convenient for them. Our clients pay the driver a contribution towards the running cost of his/her car. This is currently 50p per mile or £5 flat rate for local journeys.

Office Volunteers The AVB office in South Ascot Church Hall is open every weekday

between 10am and 12noon, to take calls and pick up messages from clients requiring transport. Each call is logged and drivers contacted to find someone able to do the job.

THIS IS OUR HOME NOW

This series of articles is about our neighbours who have moved to England as refugees or immigrants for reasons of sanctuary, persecution or economic necessity. Today it is Kveta's story. Kveta came from the Czech Republic to England in 2005 and spent two years in Rwanda.

ife in the Czech Republic was very normal, very ordinary. I worked in a factory assembling eye glasses. However the factory were making people redundant, so I moved to the UK and found cleaning and waitressing work in a hotel.

My English was very basic – like a baby, but I really enjoyed learning the language. At

the hotel there were people from all over the world, with different languages and cultures. In the Czech Republic it was really boring. Everyone was the same! Here it was really interesting. I worked long hours cleaning and waitressing, sometimes with little sleep, and the next week I would have a few days off.

I studied English, bookkeeping and accounting at the local college and found work in an office. It felt good not to be doing the

lowest jobs anymore. My daughter's father is from Rwanda, but we separated. It was difficult being on my own with a small child, but I did bookkeeping from home to support us. Later, when she went to school, she was bullied which was traumatic for us both. So. we went to Rwanda for two years. It is a very different culture there. My daughter loved the freedom to play outside and have adventures: seeing hippos and crocodiles, crossing rope bridges, climbing trees and picking avocados! Here we learn about nature from books, but there we learnt these things for real. She collected manure from the cows to grow tomatoes! In Rwanda, I set up a business making building blocks. I loved the country

and wanted to support it, but there is no perfect place, you just make a choice about where you want to be. In 2019 we came back to the UK and I have just written a children's book with lots of photos, all about our adventures.

My strength comes from my child and my friends who believe in me. When people depend on you, you can't let them down, you just have to keep going. I just believe in making the world a better place. It feels safe here in the UK. There are police and the law and it is easier to find jobs.

We go back once or twice a year to the Czech Republic. As children we would play in the hay or pick blueberries. We could jump on

our bikes and ride everywhere. In the UK, play is more about trampolining classes- it is more commercial. My daughter only speaks a bit of Czechbut she loves Czech food – like pork and dumplings! I think all these different experiences have made her quite mature for her age. She is strong and confident and happy.

Many people coming to the UK are naïve and think life will be heaven, but there are always difficulties. You have to pay the bills. You

have to work. If you have a baby you don't have the support of family around you. But maybe that's a good thing! Less interference! But living in the UK is very good. You can learn and gain experience, and whether you decide to stay here or return to your home country, you can make a difference to make the world a better place. I don't know where I would like to settle; we feel at home in all these countries. There is no perfect place, you just make a choice about where you want to be. We take each day as it comes.

EASTER RECIPE MINI EASTER EGG BLONDIES

This is an easy recipe to make with children. The blondies have a mild toffee flavour and a rich fudginess. Prep time is less than half an hour and cooking time 10 to 30 minutes. This recipe will make 16 pieces.

INGREDIENTS

- 250g/9oz cold unsalted butter, cut into 6–8 pieces
- 150g/51/20z light soft brown sugar
- 125g/41/2oz caster sugar
- 2 large free-range eggs
- 1¹/₂ tsp vanilla extract
- pinch sea salt
- 300g/10½oz plain flour
- 225g/8oz sugar-coated mini chocolate eggs

METHOD

• Preheat the oven to 190C/170C Fan/Gas 5. Grease and line a 20cm/8in square loose-based cake tin with baking paper.

• Melt the butter in a saucepan over a medium-low heat. Stir in both sugars and

cook for 1–2 minutes, or until the butter is absorbed and the mixture turns a creamy toffee colour and looks smooth and glossy. Take off the heat and set aside.

• Whisk the eggs, vanilla and salt together in a large bowl. Whisk in the melted butter and sugar mixture until thoroughly combined, then whisk in the flour until smooth. Pour the batter into the prepared tin and bake for 20 minutes.

• While the blondie is cooking, cut 125g/41/20z of the chocolate eggs in half.

• When the 20 minutes is up, take the blondie out of the oven and scatter the halved and whole chocolate eggs on top. Carefully press the eggs into the blondie mixture and don't worry if the surface cracks at little. Return to the oven for a further 10 minutes or until the blondie is pale golden-brown.

• Cool the blondie in the tin for at least 10 minutes before cutting into squares. Serve warm or cold.

PARISH PROFILE – BEN CLARK

Ben Clark is an apprentice accountant at a local Ascot firm. He also, however, has a passion for motorsport, and produces a weekly blog documenting his journey to gain the necessary skills to succeed in his own racing endeavours. It is called "Living The Racing Grind".

Racing as a sport is unique. Most sports that warrant dedicated Sky Sports channels, such as football and cricket,

are easily accessible to the masses and have hundreds of thousands, even millions of participants at all ages and abilities. Racing, on the other hand, is expensive, and needs large, purposebuilt facilities for competitions. Furthermore. the drivers who can afford the entry fees generally fall within one of two categories: those who have worked hard, done well for themselves, but are predominantly the "wrong" side of 30, and those who are able to exploit the "Bank of Mum & Dad". There are not many people

in my situation: having just turned 20 and want to race on a sustainable (i.e. shoestring) budget, whilst simultaneously launching their career in the real world.

Throughout my childhood, I've loved motorsport. My first memory of watching F1 on the TV was when I was seven, with the McLaren of Lewis Hamilton understeering into the gravel next to the pits at the 2007 Chinese Grand Prix. Back then, I used to lie on the floor intently watching the TV screen, and though watching was interesting, I always craved more. What I really wanted was to emulate my heroes, in the same way that watching Manchester United in 2007-08 inspired me to play football.

Whilst it was easy for my parents to sign me up to Ascot United's under 9s, finding opportunities for karting was much harder, and I didn't start regularly racing until I decided go-karting could be my Bronze Duke of Edinburgh "skill". Using the leverage that I had to go every week for three months was the perfect excuse! That was about 5 years ago now, and whilst I haven't been heading down to the track every week since, it's still a regular occurrence.

My newfound speed, however, has only fuelled my motorsport addiction. Now, I'm looking to my next challenge, going racing for

real. The issue I've got, though, is the same as it's always been. Money. Well, money and talent, but mainly money.

I want to be able to fund my racing sustainably, so I'm not looking to the Bank of Mum & Dad, but simultaneously, I'm just 20, so don't have a huge pot of life savings to throw away. Therefore, I'm living as scrupulously as possible to be able to afford an opportunity, whilst also making slight adaptations to my life in order to maximise my

racing performance.

So far, these have included modifying my exercise to make it more motorsport-specific, and changing the foods I eat to better fuel my body and mind. One example of a physical improvement I'm trying to undertake is to occasionally practice yoga, as muscular flexibility is very important for a racing driver.

Whilst I'd love to delve into every detail of my journey onto the starting grid, apparently there has to be space in this magazine for all of the other lovely contributors.
