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### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

Objectives and aims

Report for the SSA Parish Annual Accounts 2020

What an interesting year it was for the Parish - as well as other Church of England parishes around the world.

The year 2020 started with a full team, when the Vicar returned from leave of absence, and lots of exciting plans. In All Souls, a new family service - Ascot@3 - was started service in early March. However, we had to close both churches when the first lockdown was announced on 23rd March. Very quickly we moved full swing into virtual services, prayers, Sunday school and even toddler praise, with everyone learning a lot about Zoom, video calling, camera and mics ever since. This was a result of a very big effort from a lot of the church team and community, but most of all, a huge thank you for all the incredibly creative efforts by the Vicar and his family.

The Vicar also played a central role in community help provided by local government and local charities in the parish.

Both All Souls and St Michael's rallied into action to try to support the community, starting Buddy systems where members of the congregations phone-called other members, Zoom coffee mornings, regular prayers and letters from the Church team. Over the summer we were slowly and cautiously able to re-open the churches during the day to allow those who wanted to visit for quiet reflection and prayer. This was followed by a return to services in the autumn, which while different to earlier in the year, thanks to the creativity of the ministry team, have been amazing. Services in churches have been livestreamed and we also, just before Christmas, managed some outdoor services where singing was allowed. We hope very much that we managed to do something to help those who were worried, suffering and in need of hope and consolation throughout 2020.

Having had to close the church buildings in late March, we were pleased to be able to re-open the coffee shop in All Souls on Monday the 19th of October and the two Church Halls, before closing them all again just before Christmas.

During the year there have been a number of changes on the Church Team, and at the APCM we welcomed several new members to the PCC. We thank Verity Spencer for her great good service as Churchwarden at St Michael's as well as David Chislett who, after working so hard as Churchwarden at All Souls, stepped down to embark on his training for priesthood. We welcomed Aled Jones and Sandra Stansfield as Churchwardens at All Souls. We were also blessed to have Sarah Mortimer join us as curate in the parish. Our grateful thanks to all those who have worked so hard and served the parish so well in 2020. We particularly record the death of Chris Townsend, a much loved member of All Souls who is greatly missed for his many years work on the finance team.

Great progress was made on several projects in the parish during 2020. The roof of All Souls was repaired at great, but necessary, expense at the start of the year. A new organ was installed, which sounds beautiful, especially when being played by Judith, who joined us this year. The churchyard was closed for new burials, with maintenance passing to the local authority. A new path was laid with new railings and kissing gate to replace those old spikey things that had served us for almost 100 years. A beautiful painting was installed at All Souls church, donated by a wonderful local artist, Elizabeth Bradshaw, in memory of Lilian and Maurice Making. And last, but certainly not least, under the leadership of Fiona Jones and her husband, the renovation of the Scout Hut was completed, giving us a scout hut to serve us for another 100 years.

At St Michael's there was, luckily, no need for major works in 2020 but we continue to be vigilant in caring for the beautiful building.

In 2021, there are other projects to continue in All Souls, including the enclosing of the lady chapel, and the replacement of the church heating system.

The Christmas services at both churches were wonderful opportunities for the congregations to reach out to our communities, just before the country was again asked to stay at home. Thankfully churches were allowed to stay open and we adjusted our service timetable to meet the increased concerns of those choosing to stay at home. The services are currently all livestreamed for those worshipping at home but being able to be present in our churches is a blessing for the many who continue to be there in person.

In 2021, we look for a gradual return to normality and more social interaction but we will continue to be led by Government guidelines. The team has been strengthened by the licensing in March 2021 of the Rev Vusi Mabuza who will work primarily at All Souls.

We look forward, with hope, to 2021 and thank God for his many blessings during the past year.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

FINANCIAL REVIEW

St Michaels and All Angels

The church continues to be reliant on voluntary donations for the majority of its income. Income was impacted by Covid-19 this year, with lockdowns and reduced congregation numbers during non-lockdown periods resulting in very minimal cash and envelope giving, which is usually a good source of donations. We took the step to invest in Sum Up devices, which have proved successful in helping mitigate some of the cash and envelope loss. Fundraising was also effectively stopped for the year, though in November we did run a successful online family quiz as we reviewed our non face to face fundraising options. Wedding and funeral income also decreased due to Covid.

An appeal to the congregation in the autumn resulted in some welcome increase in regular giving, particularly in the Parish Giving space, and we had some generous one-off donations which helped the church significantly, avoiding the need to use any reserves. This meant that voluntary giving exceeded that of the previous year, and overall, our income was maintained at levels similar to 2019. We are extremely grateful to those who have supported the church through these difficult times.

We did benefit from some spend reduction during the year on utilities and supplies and with staff furlough. Investment in equipment and resources for online services was essential, and again, members of our congregation generously helped out in this area.

Investments were negatively hit during the year, causing a loss on year end revaluation.

The church had a net deficit in spend for 2020 and the PCC continues to actively review opportunities for giving and fundraising after a most difficult year.

#### All Souls

All Souls fundraising activities were impacted by Covid-19 during 2020, with both the Church Hall and Coffee shop having to be closed or have reduced operations for a large part of the year. The Church Hall did provide a reduced level of income, and this was topped up by a council grant of £10,000, which helped the church enormously.

Unrestricted voluntary donations for the year were up from the previous year, with the benefit of some legacy gifts, however restricted income reduced from last year, comprising primarily fund raising for the refurbishment of the Scout Hut.

Spend against restricted funds in 2020 comprised primarily the finishing of the Church Roof Repairs which were started in 2019, together with repairs to the graveyard path and replacement of the fence railings, and a contribution to the Scout Hut Refurbishment.

Looking forward to 2021, spend on the heating system continues to be reviewed.

#### Funds

As at 31 December 2020 total reserves for All Souls was £416,767, £326,357 of which is restricted as to the purpose to which the fund can be applied. This leaves unrestricted reserves of £50,539 together with further lightly restricted reserves of £39,871 that can be used for any ecclesiastical purpose in the parish.

Total reserves for St Michaels is £177,323, of which £13,708 is restricted.

The PCC will periodically review the availability of restricted funds and where appropriate advice will be sought to amend or remove the restrictions where desirable.

#### **RESERVES POLICY**

As recommended by both the Charity Commission and Church of England guidance the Parochial Church Council has approved a reserves policy in respect of both St Michael's & All Angels church and All Souls church, which is to invest cautiously and with investments in either M & G Charifund, CCLA or similar

#### St Michaels & All Angels

The St Michaels policy reflects routine church running costs, service costs and cyclical building repairs and maintenance but is not intended to cover in full "1 in 100 year" items or discretionary items such as major structural repairs or improvements. Such items would be covered as far as possible by grant applications and fundraising appeals with any shortfall met from reserves. The approved policy is to hold an agreed level of investments and cash in reserve (and therefore not to include these amounts when assessing general expenditure, setting the annual budget or considering any improvement plans or special projects). The amount held in reserve will be revisited each year and is based on the most recently available annual accounts.

In respect of the year ended 31 December 2020 this reserve has been maintained at £100,000 and in setting this figure the following factors were considered.

- o The age of the church and its listed building status. Whilst a number of significant building projects have been completed in the last 3 years, there are still a number of items identified in the latest quinquennial review and through discussion with the church's architect.
- o The level of general expenditure incurred in the running of the Church including employee costs and the extent of recent shortfalls
- o Any money received in advance in respect of the magazine
- " Any committed expenditure in respect of office holders and individuals who provide services on a contract basis

The list of factors to consider will be reviewed each year when the reserves policy and amount is agreed.

#### All Souls

The All Souls policy reflects routine church running costs, service costs and cyclical building repairs and maintenance but is not intended to cover "1 in 100 year" items such as major structural repairs or improvements. The reserve policy is intended to provide the church with the flexibility to undertake improvements to the structure and fabric of the building and to develop the facilities available as the church continues to grow and develop for the future. The approved policy is to hold an agreed level of investments and cash in reserve (and therefore not to include these amounts when assessing general expenditure and setting the annual budget). The amount held in reserve will be revisited each year and is based on the most recently available annual accounts. In respect of the year ended 31 December 2020 this reserve has been set at no less than six months unrestricted expenditure and in setting arriving at this figure the following factors were considered.

- o The age of the church and its listed building status
- o The relatively modest level of recent expenditure on maintenance Routine and cyclical maintenance as identified in the latest quinquennial review and through discussion with the Church's architect
- o The high level of restricted funds available for repairs to the church and for the maintenance of the graveyard.
- o The level of general expenditure incurred in the running of the Church including employee costs.
- o Any committed expenditure in respect of office holders and individuals who provide services on a contract basis
- o Any costs associated with improving the structure and fabric of the church as part of meeting the church's long-term growth and development plans

The list of factors to consider will be reviewed each year when the reserves policy and amount is agreed.

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

#### Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

• the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Tangible fixed assets**

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - At variable rates
Fixtures and fittings - 3 to 5 years on cost
Computer equipment - Straight line over 4 years

#### **Taxation**

The church is exempt from tax on its charitable activities. Accordingly it is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income and capital gains received to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes. No provision for taxation has been made in these accounts.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the church. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Endowments funds represent capital, held in perpetuity to create income for specific purposes.
